The Camp Bethany Board of Directors is excited to officially announce plans to move forward with execution of our 2022 Winter Camp Program. In order to provide a safe and healthy program we require your help! We need you to communicate the below information with all who may want to attend, or help with our 2022 Winter Camp Program. Below is what we need everyone to know.

1. This year to help with social distancing, and our growing attendance, there will be three weekends for Winter Camp. The age divisions, and registration fees are as marked below

January 7th 6:30pm-9th 1pm, 7th-8th graders, \$70

January 14th 6:30pm-17th 1pm, 11th-12th graders, \$85

January 21st 6:30pm-23rd 1pm, 9th-10th graders, \$70

2. Due to social distancing, space will be limited, for both campers and staff. **EVERYONE, INCLUDING VOLUNTEERS MUST PRE-REGISTER.** Walk-ins will be turned away, if capacity is met. Capacity is capped at 42 campers, and priority will be first-come, first-serve.
 - a. If you want to register a camper you may do so online at campbethany.org starting November 15th, 2021

Every effort will be made to accommodate if space and food allows, but we cannot stress enough, **once the capacity limit is met for both volunteers and campers**, unfortunately they will be **unable** to stay.

3. Below is the Health and Safety Protocol which the Board of Directors has voted to adopt for this year's program, please make sure you are comfortable adhering and attending with these restrictions. The Board continues to reserve the right to alter the policy leading up to or during the program for any reason.
4. We could use the support of individuals in the kitchen. We are seeking to fill 2 assistant cooks in the kitchen each weekend, either with different individuals or the same individual each weekend. If you would be willing to help prepare and serve food please contact secretary@campbethany.org.
5. We could use the support of a medical professional. We are seeking to fill 1 medical professional each weekend. This person will help control and distribute medications to campers, administer basic medical first aid if necessary, and help maintain and enforce the adopted Covid related policies below. If you would be willing to help one or more weekends please contact secretary@campbethany.org.

2022 WINTER CAMP COVID-19 HEALTH & SAFETY PROTOCOL

The accommodations listed below will reflect the protocol for the safe and healthy operations of the 2022 Camp Bethany Winter Camp Program. It is the aim of the Camp Bethany Board of Directors to establish guidelines which will be respectful of everyone's comfort level. We understand the differing opinions on the topic, but the Board has agreed to enforce the protocols outlined below to ensure a safe and healthy program for all. We ask all to review the policy and for their respectful cooperation during this time. If you have any questions or concerns regarding these protocols please email secretary@campbethany.org.

Health Screening:

- During registration, all adults and volunteers will be screened for exposure to Covid-19 and symptoms related to Covid-19. Anyone exposed to a positive case in the last 14 days or is currently experiencing symptoms will not be permitted to stay.
- Medical personnel have the right to perform additional screening of any volunteer or camper exhibiting symptoms of Covid-19.

Social Distancing:

- During meals, tables in the dining hall will be limited to 6 per table and hand washing will be mandatory before each meal. To prevent large groups in line, tables will be dismissed one at a time to wash their hands and get their food.
- Large group sessions will be conducted in the Chapel. Chairs will be placed 3 feet apart and the students will be encouraged to sit in their small groups.
- Breakout Sessions will be held in various buildings and cabins so groups can be socially distanced across camp property.

Masks

- Masks will be highly recommended and encouraged throughout the weekend for all campers and volunteers, when social distancing is not possible.
- All are asked to bring at least one mask for use during the program if possible. Disposable masks will be made available for those who do not have one when necessary.
- Deans reserve the right to mandate masks at any time if there is a situation where everyone must be contained in a small space.
- Servers will be required to wear a mask during food service.
- Accommodations will be made for campers who choose to be masked the entire time. These individuals will be allowed to room and sit with other campers who also choose to wear masks.
